<p>Wednesday 27 September</p> <p>7pm in the Paul Woodhouse Suite and 7.30pm on Zoom</p> <p>This talk will start with a drinks reception</p>	<p>‘Charlotte Yonge’s life’ by Alys Blakeway, Chair of the Charlotte M Yonge Fellowship</p> <p>This talk will explore Hampshire author, Charlotte Mary Yonge (CMY) as a Christian, focus on her as a Tractarian, and look at her relationship with individual places of worship, including the Cathedral and her parish church, St Matthew’s Otterbourne. Alys will also explore how CMY expressed these beliefs in her fiction.</p>

Including statues of Kings and noblemen, and memorials to Bishops, this talk will consider our Cathedral sculptures, the sculptors themselves, and their subjects.</p>
